Lots happening with healthcare.

One of our sponsored boys, aged 10 years old, could hardly walk and he had to be carried onto a trishaw to go to the doctors. It was found that it was due to malnutrition and lack of certain vitamins. He is now fit and well again, after we fed him at school and gave him the required vitamins.



A boy who was bitten by 6 dogs had to be flown to Yangon (a city), where he had two major operations. He would have died had we not been able to help him.

A father was hospitalized due to stomach ulcers. After treatment he can now work again.



Phyo Thura Aung went to Yangon for a foot operation, as it was deformed, so that he could walk properly. He will need further treatment, but will be able to walk normally.

A baby boy of 6 months had to have a colostomy, which was a major operation for his age. Over the next couple of years he will have to have two more major operations, which hopefully will give him a normal life.

Kyaw Zin Lin had to go to the city for an operation on a tumour, and is now back home, fit and well.

An 11 year old, had to have a blood transfusion. This is the second time in a year he has had to have a transfusion, and he had to be given 2 pints of blood recently. He was sent to the city, for tests, but unfortunately because he was given the blood so recently, the doctors have not been able to find out what is wrong. He will go back to hospital in the city in a couple of months for further tests. We will update you shortly.
